☆ PURPOSE

This week you will set the foundation for a real year. Let students know that they can expect to be challenged & expect to be heard. Through social media venues students can filter the version of themselves that is made public--at Drop Zone we want to know the real you; unfiltered.

Hot Potato Name Game: To get started, put you into group a small circle and have go everyone in the circle and introduce themselves. (Do you want them to just say their names, or would you like them to tell one or two things about themselves?) Then give them their 'hot potatoes' and let them start passing. After a few minutes, use the leader's phone to keep track of time, and have the person with the 'potato' step out of the circle. Continue until there is one or two student left.

DISCUSSION

- 2. What did you think about the video/speaker?
- 3. What are things that we try to hide about ourselves?
- 4. Why is it so hard to be real?
- 5. Think about some things you hide about yourself. Why do you think you do that?
- 6. What is a small step you could take to becoming more real about who you are?
- 7. What would you tell someone who had a problem with hiding parts of his/herself?
- 8. Take a look at Colossians 3:9 and/or Philippians 4:8-9.

☆ PURPOSE

This is the beginning of a new series entitled My Profile. This club will begin to challenge the students to think about their identity—who they are and who they will become as their life story is shaped by their life experiences.

₩ GAMES

Give each teen a 3 x 5 card and have them write their name at the top and four things about themselves they are sure no one else in the room knows. Collect the cards and hand out paper and pencils to each player. Give everyone a lined piece of paper and tell the teens to number each line. Read the cards one at a time and have the teens write down to which they believe the card is referring. When you have read all the cards, have the teens exchange papers, and read the correct answers for the teens to check the sheets. Whoever has the most right answers is the winner.

☆ PURPOSE

WGAMES

Announce, 'You've been exiled to a deserted island for a year. In addition to the essentials, you may take one piece of music, one book (which is not the Bible) and one luxury item you can carry with you i.e. not a boat to leave the island! What would you take and why?

DISCUSSION

Have a leader or two answer the three discussion questions up front, so that the students are able to see the leaders being vulnerable, and genuine. We need to be able to go there, if we are expecting the students to go there.

- 1. How would people at your school describe you in 8-10 words?
- 2. How would you like to be seen by those around you?
- 3. What are some things you might like to do once you graduate? Does who you are now match up with who you will need to be?
- 4. What needs to change so that others can see the real person that you want to be?
- 5. What makes it hard to be who you want to be?
- 6. What would make it easier to be the real you all of the time?
- 7. Read 2 Corinthians 5:17
- 8. What does your Facebook/Instagram/Twitter say about you?

Friends

☆ PURPOSE

For students to understand the value of friends and the power the role those friends can play in their lives. Friendship is a choice, and choosing who you associate with is a very important choice. Real friendship isn't just someone that you always get along with; friendship unfiltered is hard work with a huge payoff!

Use a Jenga set and put a question on each block. Every time a student pulls a block, they'll answer a question — and there's sure to be a lot of laughter as students try to keep the tower from tumbling down! We will also have question in a cup for each group if you do not have Jenga blocks available.

DISCUSSION

- 4. How do you want your friends to treat you?
- 5. How can you be a better friend tomorrow to your friends?
- 6. How can you be a better friend to people who do not have friends?

Tough Questions

☆ PURPOSE

Giant knot- Create a shoulder-to-shoulder circle, and then have each student grab two other hands from two different people across the circle. Now the entire circle must figure out how to untangle the giant knot of arms and people without letting go. The goal of this discussion is to examine and look deeper into the big life questions students may have.

- 4. How do you ask God to forgive you from your mistakes?
- 5.. Do you feel like you need God's forgiveness?
- 6. Once you ask for forgiveness (from God or someone else), how do you move past the mistakes you have made?

Anger

To help students understand that anger about the circumstances in their life is natural but they have the choice to either grow from those experiences or else stay stuck in their anger.

☆ PURPOSE

The trend in our world is that respect is earned, never given. If someone treats us poorly or doesn't fit our mold of what we think is "cool," we don't treat them with respect. This week we want kids to see that Jesus teaches us that we love and respect others no matter what.

WGAMES

Move if You... - Have students sit in a large circle with one person in the middle. The middle person calls out for a certain group of people to move — for example, "Move if you have brown hair" or "Move if you have been to another country." If the students fit the criteria, they must run to a new seat in the circle. The one student left standing is in the middle for the next round.
